15,000 BALTIMORE JEWS MAY LOSE VOTES

Baltimore, Md.—A total of 15,000 Jewish voters in this city will not be able to vote in the fall elections if a ruling made by Willis R. Jones, Assistant Attorney-General, is not overturned. This is due to the fact that the registration days fall on September 23 and 24 when Rosh Hashana occurs and on October 7 and 8 when Succoth takes place. The ruling was made in reply to a request from the President of the Board of Supervisors of Elections. In his ruling Mr. Jones said that there was no method "by which the registration days may be changed to accommodate those members of the Jewish faith who would not register on one of these days. The Board of Supervisors of Elections has no authority to change the time fixed by the Legislature."

An additional problem is raised by the fact that in many sections of the city the registration boards are composed almost entirely of Jews. This would entail the appointment of non-Jewish officials. City authorities have expressed an interest as to whether all Jews will abstain from registration or whether only the orthodox will abstain.


JEWISH DIVORCE NOT MODERN, RABBIS SAY

Tannersville, N. Y.—The Jewish divorce laws, particularly as they relate to the "Agunah," must be revised in accordance with modern ideas of the status of women, according to a report presented by Rabbi Louis Epstein of Boston to the annual convention of the Rabbinical Assembly of the Jewish Theological Seminary meeting here. Rabbi Epstein said that the divorce laws should be changed so that a woman desiring a divorce, when she is deserted, should be able to obtain not only a civil decree, but also a rabbinical decree. At the present time she is neither widow nor wife, since rabbinic law does not release the woman until the husband assents to a divorce. Rabbi I. H. Levinthal of Brooklyn Jewish Center was elected President of the Rabbinical Assembly for the coming year.

HURLEY AWARDS WAR MEDAL TO ROTH

Washington, D. C.—The Soldiers Medal of the War Department was presented to Master Sergeant Benjamin E. Roth, aide to Admiral Byrd on the Antarctic Expedition, by Secretary of War Hurlley in recognition of his service to science. Roth will be one of the first to get the medal, for which no design has yet been made. In reading the citation accompanying the medal for Roth Major-General Fechet, chief of the Air Corps, said that it was conferred "for heroism while serving as a member of the 1928-30 Byrd Antarctic expedition . . . brought great credit to himself, the expedition and the United States Army."
